RECREATION, PARKS, AND THE UNKNOWN FUTURE

With expenses, structure and staff in a state of flux due to the present financial crisis, Santa Monica community recreation programs and facilities, park development, use, operations and maintenance face significant cuts that although not finalized, will have a negative effect for years to come. These come at a time when Santa Monicans are looking to do more with the open space we have.

One of the victims of the new austerity is the long-awaited Recreation and Parks Master Plan Update, the draft of which was set to be released to the public in March 2020 before being submitted to Council for approval. After City Council approval, the plan would have set the course for public parks, open space and park development and acquisition for the next 20 years. It is now shelved indefinitely. Although some modifications are anticipated, in part as a result of advocacy by the community, here is a broad summary of some of the current proposals: The Swim Center, Memorial Park Gym, and Skate Park will continue to operate, but hours will be reduced. Cultural and recreational programming offerings will be scaled back considerably. Access to courts, and fields will be greatly reduced and public use of school sites during non-school hours will be eliminated. The Annenberg Community Beach House pool will remain closed in FY2021-2023.

Even with social distancing restrictions, reductions and eliminations in aquatics programs, pool use and athletic field use will affect thousands of children and adults in our community. Other facilities — tennis courts, gyms, basketball courts — will also face use reductions. Right now it is impossible to know exactly how much will ultimately be cut, but advocacy is and will be important.

LETTER ABOUT THE BUDGET

Santa Monica is in the process of addressing a huge deficient in our city's budget. NOMA has contacted our City Council to recommend possible savings, advocate prioritizing certain services, and to warn against using this crisis to push through new development standards unrelated to our current budget problem. Below are some of the services NOMA, Friends of Sunset Park, Mid-City Neighbors, Northeast Neighbors, Pico Neighborhood Association, and Wilmont all agreed the City should prioritize:

- Fire Department (SMFD)
- Police Department (SMPD)
- Sanitation Services including sewer, storm drains and public refuse receptacles
- City-Supported Before/After School Youth Programs

- Street and Alley Maintenance
- Water -- No resident water/wastewater fees beyond scheduled rate increases for the next five years
- Public transportation should be maintained (Big Blue Bus and MODE).
- Public Libraries
- Housing Authority -- Continue to fund senior housing including
 Preserving Our Diversity (POD).
- City Parks
- Maintain commitments to Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District (SMMUSD)
- The Reduce Homelessness Framework, including the Homeless
 Multidisciplinary Street Team

Additionally, we cautioned against using this crisis to push for fast approval of Development Agreements and entitlements. We are specifically concerned about four projects: Miramar, the Getty-designed hotel on Ocean Ave, the Plaza at Santa Monica on 4th/5th Sts. and Arizona (public land) and St. John's. The idea of getting an entitlement

now to build in the future has been used by developers before i.e., Village Trailer Park. Additionally, analysis needs to be done of the cost of these developments to the City's infrastructure including police, fire, water, sewer, power and more vs. the revenue they could generate.
